FEEDING THE HUNGRY Shortly after Sheriff Holloway assumed office the Chaplain Division, under the direction of Chaplain David Myers, began a garden project for inmates at the Benton County Detention Center. This picture was taken in early August. Last year the jail garden produced over 5000 pounds of food which was delivered to Helping Hands for distribution to those in need. This year they expect comparable harvest numbers.

The recidivism rate among those who are permitted to work the garden is extremely low. Those tending are coached by certified master gardeners, and some of the inmates, themselves, become certified master gardeners as well
