Pea Ridge Police Officer Kevin Apple was remembered by his family, department and the community on the second anniversary of his death on June 26, 2021. His death

was commemorated by a candlelight vigil at the scene of his death at Slack Street and Townsend Way. Officer Apple had made contact with a vehicle being pursued by the Rogers Police Department. The driver of the car sped away from the scene, running over and killing the officer.

SHARPENING SKILLS—GET BETTER AT WHAT THEY DO

Chaplains Galen Pearcy and Jim Dixon attended crisis response training classes in late June. The classes were hosted by John Brown University in Siloam Springs and presented by K-LOVE and Crisis Response Care. Courses taken by the two included Psychological First Aid for First Responders, Crisis Care During Traumatic Grief. Additionally, Chaplain Pearcy took Enhancing Resilience and Youth Suicide: Awareness and Prevention.

Working on these skills better equips chaplains who respond to events where trauma is expected or might occur. All of the BCSO Chaplains are crisis-response trained and ready to serve when called upon.
